

UNITED COLLEGIATE UMPIRES 2021 Universal COVID-19 Protocols/Recommendations

UPDATED: SUNDAY, MARCH 7

- Keep Track of Kits do not run out with Access Medical Labs or MAKO kits
- If you are an umpire who is added to a conference and do not have a kit, you must notify Alex Skandalis
- KNOW YOUR TEST-COMPLIANCE SEASON-LONG RESPONSIBILITIES
- TESTS SHOULD BE SHIPPED FROM SPECIAL MEDICAL FEDEX AND UPS LOCATIONS BEFORE NOON ET
- When a school is antigen testing on-site, be aware, they may be testing ONLY the plate umpire(s). So, decide who is working the plate/rotation in advance of arriving – Antigen Testing – 90 minutes before
- Communication with partners is key, need to touch base the day before and set rotation if that is your option (all but Division I Conferences)
- If you are a veteran and are working with a new umpire, be a leader and make sure they know where they are going, etc. No ego here, all on same team

UPDATED: SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 28

 Masks are mandatory from arrival on-site, through the game and upon exit from site

- Mask must be on the face, the ump-attire product that attaches to the mask only can be an "additional" mask, but not the only mask you wear as a plate umpire
- Off-field close contact with another umpire is strongly discouraged - to include the use of locker rooms, sharing hotel rooms, dining and driving together
- Officials shall not engage in pregame/postgame or in-game handshakes/fist bumps/contact with partners, players, coaches, or administrators
- Pregame plate meeting: Led by crew chief conducted 10-feet apart, no handshakes, masks must be worn
- Officials will maintain physical distancing. In those cases, the officials should avoid speaking face-to-face and maintain some distance
- Coaches should never enter the dirt circle or field of play
- Umpire/coach interactions should occur at edge of dirt circle or 45' line with physical distance
- Officials may wear gloves including medical latex gloves, work gloves or gloves designed specifically for officiating
- Officials may wear plastic face shields which connect to a hat,
 wrap around the forehead or hang around the neck
- Bring your own small bottle of sanitizer
- Conferences will dictate handling of baseball policies
- If umpire is not feeling well or has a low-grade fever, call Chris Marshall/Alex Skandalis immediately – do not work a game when not feeling well
- Should there be any issues with a host university in terms of COVID-related working conditions, bring to the attention of UCU administrators – do NOT initiate confrontation with host university personnel
- If you test positive for Covid-19, Chris Marshall and Alex Skandalis must be notified immediately and you cannot return until all quarantine guidelines have been met and a subsequent negative test can be documented
