

## NCAA Baseball Interpretation February 22, 2019

## Rule 8-5-n - Baserunner Runs to Outfield Area to Avoid Being Tagged

A runner is out when:

n. The individual runs bases in reverse order to confuse opponents or to make a travesty of the game;

This will also include the situation where a runner, after legally touching a base, runs into the outfield area to avoid being tagged, and in the judgment of the umpire, abandons his effort to run the bases.

**Penalty for n.-** The ball is dead and other runner(s) return to the base last touched.

Play: R1 and R3, less than 2 outs. R1 runs into the outfield area of right field and stands there in an effort to draw a play that would allow R3 to score. In the judgment of the umpire, he has abandoned his effort to either advance to 2<sup>nd</sup> base or return safely to 1<sup>st</sup> base.

Result: The umpire shall call "time", the ball is dead, R1 is out, and R3 remains at 3<sup>rd</sup> base.
